Pastors graduating from Theology College

Since being in exile in Uganda, four have graduated with degrees in theology, eleven with diplomas and four with certificates.

They have learned to read and write English, the official language. The new District Superintendent translated worship services in the Book of Worship into their native language. They can conduct services in a language the people understand. They preach the Gospel, teach the Bible, grow the faith, form disciples and raise their families without support. They struggle to provide school fees for their own children.
